Directors' review

SUMMARY OF PERFORMANCE

We are pleased to present the Directors' Report together with the unaudited Financial Statements for the quarter ended September 30, 2025.

The consolidated revenue showed a consistent growth over the same period last year despite facing various economic challenges in different segments. This achievement reflects the effectiveness of management's strategic efforts to stabilize the group top line. A significant portion of this progress attributed to the performance of Treet Corporation Limited.

As interest rates have stabilised around 11%, the financial cost due to high interest rates that has been a massive burden on our profitability across all Group companies in the past few years has significantly eased. A 46% decrease in borrowing costs was registered across the Group in first quarter of FY 25-26 compared to the same period last year.

Over the first quarter of fiscal year 2025-2026, the Group has delivered strong profitability, signalling positive



momentum in its ongoing turnaround journey. With local inflation easing and global commodity prices stabilizing, the outlook for the next quarters remains optimistic. The Group is actively advancing its new export sales model, aiming to boost export volumes and strengthen both short-term performance and long-term market positioning. Backed by the continued support of our shareholders, the Group is wellpositioned to capitalize on the ongoing economic recovery.

BUSINESS REVIEW - TREET CORPORATION LIMITED

During the period under review, the company recorded net revenues of PKR 3,683 Mn, representing a growth of 11% over the corresponding period last year (PKR 3,316 Mn). This growth was primarily driven by the domestic market, which delivered a strong performance with a 38% increase in revenues.

However, the Export segment witnessed a decline of 41% following long overdue price rationalization and intense competition in key global markets. While existing customers remained cautious about paying a premium for higher quality products, potential new buyers also demonstrated limited responsiveness. As a result, the company faced challenges in generating new business during the guarter.

To address these export related headwinds, the Company is implementing a revitalized export strategy aimed at regaining volumes from key customers and markets while maintaining sustainable profitability. Efforts are being directed toward the launch of the Modern Trade channel in the GCC in the first phase, along with expanding outreach to new distributors and markets. Special focus will be placed on Muslim countries with similar hygiene practices, where strong potential exists for deeper market penetration of our disposable hygiene razor category. These initiatives position TCL to rebuild its international footprint and drive sustainable export growth in the coming years.

The Company achieved a gross profit of PKR 1,372 Mn for the quarter, reflecting a significant increase of 38% over the same period last year. This improvement was supported by strong volume growth, better product mix and disciplined cost management, all contributing to improved gross margins.

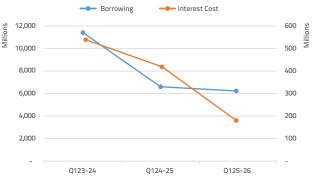
Operating profit rose to PKR 525 million, up 54% compared to the corresponding quarter of the previous

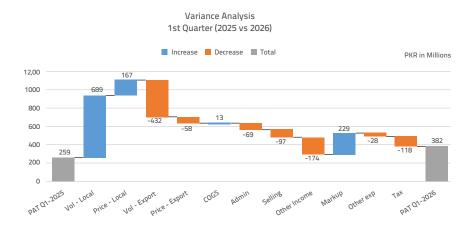
year, driven by higher gross margins and disciplined control over operating expenses.

Despite recent improvements in the interest rate environment, finance cost remains a key focus area; while the future outlook regarding interest rates remains unclear, finance cost has posted a sharp decline of 55%, which has also significantly contributed towards overall profitability of the company. As a result of this positive



development and continued management efforts, the company reported a profit after tax of PKR 382 Mn, compared to PKR 259 Mn in the corresponding quarter of the previous year.

Overall, the company has demonstrated notable improvements across key performance indicators, particularly in profitability and liquidity. The solid results during the first quarter were primarily driven by robust domestic sales, better cost management and a sharp decline in finance cost. With strategic export initiatives now underway and a renewed focus on targeted international markets, the company remains confident of sustaining overall growth and regaining a consistent upward trajectory in exports over the coming years.



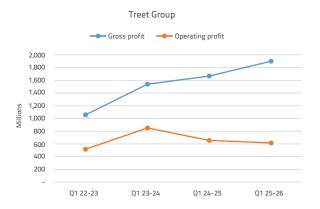
GROUP RESULTS

For the first quarter of FY 2025–2026, the Group's turnover was Rs. 6,985 million, which is in line with the revenue of Rs. 6,956 Million registered in same period last year. The stable top line is a testament to management efforts in ongoing difficult commercial environments in various business segments.

Gross profit at Rs. 1,888 million shows a significant improvement of 13.7% over the same period last year, which was Rs. 1,661 million. Key drivers of this have been improvements to the product mix and pricing interventions in key areas.



Despite the significant impact of inflation on operating costs, the Group was successful in generating an operating profit of Rs. 621 million, a slight decline of 5.5% from Rs. 658 million in the same period last year. We have also managed to bring down our borrowing costs, which decreased by a significant 45.8% from same period last year. The company managed to deliver positive bottom line with a profit after tax of Rs. 132 million in the first quarters of 2025–2026, registering a significant improvement from profit after tax of Rs. 78.2Mn(Restated) in the same period last year.

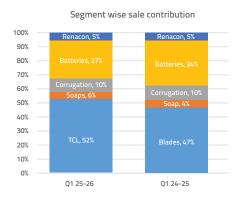


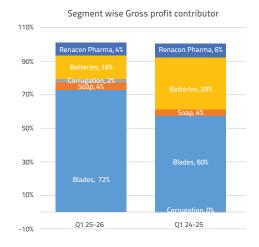

TREET TREET BATTERY LIMITED (TBL)

The first quarter of 2025-2026 has been particularly challenging for the battery industry in general and back up segment in specific, due to severe flooding in major areas of Pakistan, which has further dampened demand by disrupting retail operations, damaging infrastructure, and shifting consumer priorities toward basic needs and recovery efforts. These disruptions have delayed buying decisions, particularly for non-essential items, as well as forcing customers to opt for cheaper options than they would normally have selected. At the same time, a notable reduction in load shedding across major urban and rural areas has lessened the immediate need for backup power solutions.

On the other hand, the maintenance free segment of the Company performed exceptionally well, endorsing its premium quality and performance.

During the period under review, the company reported a decline in sales revenue, which dropped to Rs. 1,871 million, compared to Rs. 2,354 million in the same period last year, reflecting a year-over-year decrease of approximately 20.5%. Similarly, gross profit also declined, falling to Rs. 296 million from Rs. 479 million in the corresponding period of the previous year.

FIRST TREET MANUFACTURING MODARABA (FTMM)

The Modaraba is engaged in two business segments: Corrugated Boxes and Soaps. During the first quarter of the fiscal year 2025–26, the Modaraba recorded a modest increase in revenue, resulting in higher operating profit compared to the corresponding period of the previous year. This growth in revenue is primarily attributed to the management's aggressive business expansion strategies, focusing on both segments.



The Modaraba's operating profit for the quarter rose significantly to Rs.

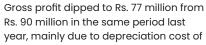
65.8 million, compared to Rs. 25.4 million reported in the same period last year. This improvement was mainly driven by effective cost management and the absence of a one-off marketing expense that had impacted the soap segment in the prior year.

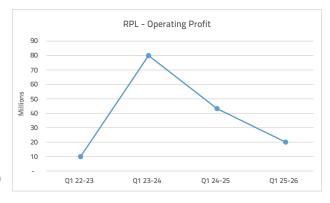
Furthermore, the Modaraba achieved a net profit of Rs. 68.2 million during the first quarter of FY 2025–26, a substantial increase from Rs. 18.6 million earned in the corresponding quarter of the previous year. The Modaraba remains fully committed to sustaining this positive momentum by optimizing its resources and focusing on operational excellence to deliver continued growth and value for its stakeholders.



RENACON PHARMA LIMITED (RPL)

The net revenue for the period showed strong growth, increasing by 8% compared to the same period last year mainly due to increase in local sales, while export sales remained stable. The Company remains optimistic about future prospects, with key focus on increasing exports - a strategic priority moving forward.





new plant. Operating profit also took a hit, plummeting 54% to Rs. 20 million from Rs. 43 million driven by lower gross profit and investments in export development.

The new manufacturing facility was successfully commissioned in January 2025, after covering all regulatory requirements. Therefore, management is focusing on export development activities to increase the Company's export footprint.

Notes to the condensed interim financial statements (un-audited) For the period ended September 30, 2025

1. STATUS AND NATURE OF THE BUSINESS

Treet Corporation Limited ("the Company") was incorporated in Pakistan on 22 January 1977 as a Public Limited Company under the Company's Act 1913 (now Companies Ordinance 1984). Its shares are listed on Pakistan Stock Exchange Limited. The principal activity of the Company is to manufacture and sale of razors and razor blades along with other trading activities. The registered office of the Company is situated at 72-B, Industrial Area, Kot Lakhpat, Lahore.

2. BASIS OF PREPARATION

These unconsolidated financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting and reporting standards as applicable in Pakistan. The accounting and reporting standards applicable in Pakistan comprise of:

- International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRSs) issued by the International Accounting Standards Board (IASB) as are notified under the provisions of the Companies Act, 2017
- Islamic Financial Accounting Standards (IFAS) issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants
 of Pakistan as notified under the Companies Act, 2017
- Provisions of and directives issued under the Companies Act, 2017

Where provisions of and directives issued under the Companies Act, 2017 differ from the IFRS Standards, the provisions of and directives issued under the Companies Act, 2017 have been followed.

These condensed interim unconsolidated financial statements comprise the condensed interim unconsolidated statement of financial position of the Company as at 30 September 2025 and the related condensed interim unconsolidated statement of profit or loss, condensed interim unconsolidated statement of comprehensive income, condensed interim unconsolidated statement of changes in equity and condensed interim unconsolidated statement of cash flows together with the notes forming part thereof.

These condensed interim unconsolidated financial statements are being submitted to the shareholders as required by section 237 of the Companies Act, 2017 and are un-audited as required by Code of Corporate Governance.

These condensed interim unconsolidated financial statements do not include all of the information required for annual financial statements and should be read in conjunction with the annual unconsolidated financial statements as at and for the year ended 30 June 2025. Selected explanatory notes are included to explain events and transactions that are significant to and understanding of the changes in the Company's financial position and performance since the last financial statements.

Comparative unconsolidated statement of financial position's numbers are extracted from the annual audited unconsolidated financial statements of the Company for the year ended 30 June 2025, whereas comparative unconsolidated profit or loss, statement of comprehensive income, cash flow statement and statement of changes in equity are stated from unaudited condensed interim unconsolidated financial statements of the Company for the 3 months period ended 30 September 2024.

3 **ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

Accounting policies adopted for the preparation of these condensed financial statements are the same as those applied in the preparation of the financial statements of the Company for the year ended 30 June 2025.

Further, the comparative condensed interim financial statements for the corresponding quarter of the previous period has been restated to reflect the impact of depreciation changes made for improved comparability and consistency in presentation with the current period. These restatements do not affect the overall financial position of the Company but have been made to ensure better alignment with the current period's classification and disclosures

1. STATUS AND NATURE OF THE BUSINESS

The Group comprises:

Holding Company

Treet Corporation Limited (TCL)

Subsidiary Companies / Undertakings

First Treet Manufacturing Modaraba (FTMM)
Treet HR Management (Private) Limited (THRM)
Treet Power Limited (TPL)
Renacon Pharma Limited (RPL)
Treet Battery Limited (TBL)
Treet Trading LLC (TLLC)

- 1.1 Treet Corporation Limited (the holding Company) was incorporated in Pakistan on 22 January 1977 as a Public Limited Company under the Companies Act, 1913. Its shares are listed on Pakistan Stock Exchange Limited. The principal activity of the holding company is to manufacture and sell razors and razor blades along with other trading activities. The registered office of the holding company is situated at 72-B, Industrial Area Kot Lakhpat, Lahore.
- 1.2 Treet Holdings Limited was incorporated in Pakistan on 21 October 2004 as a Private Limited Company under the Companies Ordinance, 1984. Global Econo Trade Limited commenced its commercial operations from 01 January 2005. The principal activity of the company is the business of manufacturing and sale of bikes. The company was converted into Public Limited Company (unlisted), and the name and objects of the company have also been changed from that of Global Econo Trade (Private) Limited to Treet Holdings Limited w.e.f June 03, 2015 after complying with the legal formalities. Its registered office is situated at 72 B, Industrial Area Kot Lakhpat, Lahore.
- 1.3 First Treet Manufacturing Modaraba ("the Modaraba") is a multipurpose, perpetual and multi dimensional Modaraba formed on 27 July 2005 under the Modaraba Companies and Modaraba (Flotation and Control) Ordinance, 1980 and rules framed there-under and is managed by Treet Holdings Limited (a wholly owned subsidiary of Treet Corporation Limited), incorporated in Pakistan under the repealed Companies Ordinance, 1984 (now Companies Act, 2017) and registered with the Registrar of Modaraba Companies. The registered office of the Modaraba is situated at 72 B, Kot Lakhpat, Industrial Area, Lahore. The Modaraba is listed on Pakistan Stock Exchange Limited. The Modaraba is engaged in the manufacture and sale of corrugated boxes and soaps.
- 1.4 Treet HR Management (Private) Limited was incorporated in Pakistan on September 18, 2006 as a Private Limited Company under the Companies Ordinance, 1984. The company is engaged in the business of rendering professional & technical services and providing related workforce to the host companies / customers under service agreements. The name of the company has been changed from TCL Labor-Hire Company (Private) Limited to Treet HR Management (Private) Limited with effect from December 31, 2014 after complying with the legal formalities. The registered office of the company is situated at 72-B, Industrial Area, Kot Lakhpat, Lahore. The company is a wholly owned subsidiary of Treet Holdings Limited , which is also a wholly owned subsidiary of Treet Corporation Limited an ultimate parent, a listed company.

- Treet Power Limited was incorporated on 20 November 2007 in Pakistan as an unquoted Public Limited Company under the Companies Ordinance, 1984. At present Treet Power Limited is planning to set up an electric power generation project for generating, distribution and selling of electric power. Its registered office is situated at 72-B, Industrial Area Kot Lakhpat, Lahore.
- 1.6 Renacon Pharma Limited (RPL) was incorporated on 07 July 2009 as a Private Limited Company under the Companies Ordinance, 1984. The company was converted into Public Limited Company (unlisted) on 27 January 2017 after complying with the legal formalities. The Company engaged in the business of manufacturing of all types of formulations of Hemodialysis Concentrate in powder and solution form for all brands of machines. Treet Corporaiton Limited has acquired 58.16% equity stake in the company on 18 January 2017. The registered office of the company is situated at 72-B, Industrial Area, Kot Lakhpat, Lahore.
- 1.7 Treet Battery Limited was incorporated on 22 February 2019 in Pakistan under the Companies Act, 2017 and in the process of initiating its operations by the period end. The Company will carry out business as manufacturers, assemblers, processors, producers, suppliers, sellers, importers, exporters, makers, fabricators and dealers in all batteries including but not limited to lead acid batteries, deep cycle batteries, lithium batteries, nickel cadmium batteries, nickel metal hydride batteries, absorbed glass mat (AGM) batteries, Gel batteries used in or required for industrial, transport, commercial and domestic and any other purpose. The registered office of the Company is situated at 72-B, Industrial Area, Kot Lakhpat, Lahore.
- 1.8 The Group has incorporated a wholly owned foreign subsidiary in Dubai, named Treet Trading L.L.C on 26 June 2024. The principal place of business of the company is API World Tower, Ground Floor, Office 206, UNBOX Business Center, Sheikh Zayed Road, Dubai. The Company made an investment in 375,000 fully paid ordinary shares of AED 1 each during the reporting period. The subsidiary will engage in the business of general trading.

2 **BASIS OF PREPARATION**

These condensed interim financial statements are un-audited and has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the approved Accounting Standards as applicable in Pakistan relating to Interim Financial Reporting. These condensed interim financial statements do not include all the information required for full annual financial statements, and should be read in conjunction with the financial statements of the Company for the year ended 30 June 2025.

3 **ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

The accounting policies and the methods of computation adopted in the preparation of these condensed interim financial statements are the same as those applied in preparation of the financial statements for the year ended 30 June 2025 except the below mentioned change;

Further, the comparative condensed consolidated interim financial statements for the corresponding quarter of the previous period has been restated to reflect the impact of depreciation changes made for improved comparability and consistency in presentation with the current period. These restatements do not affect the overall financial position of the Company but have been made to ensure better alignment with the current period's classification and disclosures.
